Together we ensured our lowest paid colleagues get a fairer return on their work

Some of the lowest paid people at the University of Auckland can now look forward to earning enough to make ends meet, to provide for their families and whānau, or to have a little extra so they can do more fun things together at the weekend.

Our colleagues will get a fairer return on their work because we stood together and negotiated collectively - and won a 4 percent pay increase for the lowest paid for each of the next 2 years. Ensuring a fair deal in the professional staff pay review is a priority for 2018.

Together we persuaded the new government to change the law so staff and students will be represented on university councils

Publicly funded tertiary education institutions where staff and students can decide their own future benefits us all.

This year we stood together and stopped the last government from passing legislation to funnel more public funding into the hands of for-profit companies - and thanks to our work the government will scrap the plans.

Thanks to our campaigning, the new Minister of Education has also confirmed that in 2018 the new government will write into law staff and student representation on each institution's council.

Together we convinced management to work with us to address excessive workloads so we have more time to enjoy life

We bring more richness to our jobs when we have time to pursue our interests, have fun with whānau and friends, and recuperate.

We know more and more of you are expected to work longer hours and that this pressure is impacting on students – after all, our conditions of work are their conditions of learning.
